APPLICATION DEADLINE

The undergraduate major is a limited access program requiring a School application. Meeting the application eligibility requirements does not guarantee admission. Admission is available for the summer/fall semesters only and requires a minimum of two years to complete. Please note that major coursework begins in the fall semester.

To be considered for admission, students must complete the online registration form <u>AND</u> submit their paperbased application to the College of Communication and Information Advising Center University Center C, Suite 4115, by <u>February 3, 2014 by 5 PM EST</u>. Paper-based applications can be submitted beginning January 6, 2014 when the online registration form opens.

Students will be sent notification regarding their acceptance or denial through the e-mail address as listed on their online "Undergraduate Application Registration Form". Decisions will be released on Friday, February 28, 2014 by 5PM EST.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION ELIGIBILITY

Students who wish to major in Communication Science & Disorders must have fulfilled the following requirements by February 3, 2014, in order for the application to be reviewed:

- 1. Have an all-college GPA of a 3.0 or higher through fall 2013
- 2. Liberal Studies course substitutions, if applicable, must be approved by the appropriate dean and posted to the transcript.
- 3. All college credit must be posted to the transcript. Examples include, but are not limited to: AP, AICE, IB, dual-enrollment, CLEP and transient coursework.
- 4. All coursework for application eligibility must be reflected on submitted transcripts and/or spring 2014 class schedules by the application deadline

In addition, students who wish to major in Communication Science & Disorders must fulfill the following requirements, or earn an AA degree from a Florida public community-college or university, <u>by the end of the spring semester 2014</u>:

- 1. All FSU Liberal Studies courses must be successfully completed
- 2. All FSU Computation and Writing (W) courses must be successfully completed
- 3. Complete a minimum of 52 hours of undergraduate coursework accepted by FSU

If you do not meet all of the requirements stated above, you may not turn in an application for review

 - 4. Printed copy of your spring 2014 class schedule

Transfer students attending another institution other than FSU (including high school A.A. recipients) must also submit the following materials as part of their application.

- 5. *Transfer student verification form* (page three of this document)
- 6. Spring 2014 AA recipients must provide proof of graduation from their Registrar's office (See page three for acceptable forms of proof)

Completion of AA in summer 2014

• Regardless of the transferring institution, application eligibility will be determined based on whether the student has completed <u>all</u> of the Universities Liberal Studies and Computation & Writing (W) requirements as set by Florida State University <u>by the end of the spring 2014 semester</u>. It is expected that the student will utilize the summer 2014 semester to complete remaining elective credits needed to complete the AA degree as set by the student's current institution.

- Official Transcript (include as part of your application package. <u>DO NOT</u> send transcripts separately).
- Students receiving an AA in spring 2014 must provide proof of graduation. Proof is defined as a completed application to graduate (which must have a signature of a university official) or letter from the Registrar indicating when the AA degree will be completed. Failure to provide such information will result in the student being evaluated according to Florida State University's individual Liberal Studies and Computation & Writing (W) requirements.
- Students simultaneously earning a high school diploma and AA degree at the end of the spring 2014 semester can submit a letter from the AA institution denoting the AA degree will be completed and posted upon completion of the high school diploma.
