

Interdepartmental Developmental Disabilities Certificate Program

Current undergraduates are eligible to pursue an interdepartmental Certificate in Developmental Disabilities, which provides a foundation of knowledge regarding etiology, treatment and policy issues related to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families.

The certificate program consists of twelve (12) credit hours to include: **a core course** (3 hours), **two additional courses** (6 hours) and finally participation in a **practicum** (3 hours). Students can not participate in the practicum until classroom coursework is completed. An application is required, which can be found on page two of this form. Practicum placement is limited, so please submit your application as soon as possible.

PLEASE NOTE: Students must complete the nine hours of classroom credit in three different departments.
