Telepractice Position Announcement (Job ID 39290)

The School of Communication Science and Disorders at Florida State University invites applications for the position of Associate or Assistant Professor beginning Fall 2016. Qualifications for Assistant Professor rank include: (a) earned doctorate in communication sciences and disorders or related areas, (b) experience in teaching and research and/or service delivery using telepractice, and (c) clinical certification. Additional qualifications for Associate Professor rank include: (a) established program of research, (b) history of external funding or clear indication of potential to obtain external funding, and (c) strong teaching record. Experience in research and practice related to Telepractice in communication disorders is required. This is a full-time, tenured or tenure-track position, with a 9-month appointment; academic year requirements include teaching at the undergraduate and/or graduate level, research and service. The position is intended to support the University's and School's initiative in the area of Telepractice and collaborative research with related fields. Specific responsibilities will be assigned at the time of hire.

Florida State University is classified by the Carnegie Foundation as a very high research activity institution with outstanding research facilities and infrastructure support. In addition, the state of Florida has recognized Florida State University as one of two preeminent research universities in the state. The School of Communication Science and Disorders is in the College of Communication and Information at Florida State University. Students can earn undergraduate, masters', and doctoral degrees. The masters' program includes both on-campus and distance learning cohorts. The School is ranked in the top 25 nationally. The environment is highly collaborative with faculty members who have intersecting research interests that include many aspects of clinical, translational, and basic research. The School is located in a newly remodeled stand-alone building with ample space for faculty, research laboratories, and diverse clinical programs. There is an on-site speech, language and hearing clinic that services Tallahassee and the surrounding counties and a specialty clinic dedicated to assessment and treatment of specific clinical populations (e.g., recent veterans) is presently underway.
