Interdepartmental Developmental Disabilities Certificate

Current undergraduate students are eligible to pursue and Interdepartmental Certificate in Developmental Disabilities, which provides a foundation of knowledge regarding etiology, treatments and policy issues related to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. The certificate program consists of twelve (12) credit hours to include: a core course (3 hours), two additional courses in other departments (6 hours) and participation in a practicum course (3 hours). Students cannot participate in the practicum until classroom coursework is completed with a 3.0 GPA in all 3 courses. An application is required, which can be found on the link https://commdisorders.cci.fsu.edu/academic-programs-admissions/undergraduate-programs/. Practicum placement is limited, so please submit your application as soon as possible.

PLEASE NOTE: Students must complete the nine hours of classroom credit in <u>three different departments</u>.
